

Renguang Zuo

Renguang Zuo became a Fellow of AAG in 2016. He received his Ph.D from the China University of Geosciences (CUG) in 2009. As a jointly supervised PhD candidate by CUG and York University (Toronto, Canada), Renguang studied for one year at the York University (supervisors: Prof. Qiuming Cheng and Prof. Frits Agreberg) during 2007-2008. He has been working at the state key laboratory of Geological Processes and Mineral Resources at CUG since he obtained Ph.D. in 2009. At the end of 2012, he was promoted to a full professor. In 2014 as a senior visiting scholar, he worked together with John Carranza for four months at the James Cook University (Townsville, Australia). He is currently serving as an associate editor for *Geochemistry: Exploration, Environment, Analysis, Journal of Geochemical Exploration, Natural Resources Research, and Computers & Geosciences*. As a guest editor, he organized four special issues related to geochemical mineral exploration and mapping mineral prospectivity. Renguang has published more than 70 peer-reviewed papers. He was awarded the Kaharaka Award by the International Association of GeoChemistry in 2015 due to his contributions to applied geochemistry. Renguang's work promoted GIS-based geochemical mineral exploration and built a wide range of international cooperation.
